## Number 37 in the series "God's Virtuous Woman"

Before I put my trust in Christ as my Savior, the words of my mouth were not skillful or full of godly wisdom. The Bible tells us that what is in our hearts will come out of our mouth. So often we want to change other people. I knew I needed Him to start with me. I also prayed from Ezekiel 36:24-27, where God promised His people that He would cleanse them from all their sin, remove their stony

heart, give them a new heart and a new spirit, and put His Spirit within them. I knew I badly needed God to do heart surgery on me. Jeremiah 17:9 (NAS) reads, "The heart is more deceitful than all else and is desperately sick; Who can understand it?" This was a picture of my heart, deceitful and desperately sick. I thank God that He did not give me a transplant of someone else's heart. He gave me a new heart and a new Spirit.

Each of us can make a lot of outward changes. We can make a New Year's resolution; daily we can determine to change our attitude and turn from sinful habits and live godly lives, but you and I know that it won't last. Only as we cry out to God to give us a new heart and daily fill us with His Spirit will we experience permanent changes in our lives that glorify Jesus. If you need changes in your life, cry out to God to give you a new heart and a new Spirit. He'll answer your prayers.

I am so grateful for all the changes He has brought into my life and in my marriage, and I know what He has done for me, He can do for you. Surrender your life to Christ and let Him bring the changes that will bring Him glory.
