"Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life; and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever." Psalm 23:6 NKJV

Number 34 in the series "The Lord is My Shepherd"

When David wrote this psalm, he had a bold assurance. Look at the words: "I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever." Let's look closely at those words. I will. Psalm 27:4 (NASB) reads, "One thing I have asked from the LORD, that I shall seek: That I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the LORD and to meditate in His temple."
