family out of the flood. He closed them safely in the ark in the midst of the flood. The flood that destroyed everyone and every living thing is the same flood that pushed Noah and his family up closer to God. God did not allow them to drown in the flood. Closed securely in the ark, Noah and his family were raised up above it by God!

Beloved, just like David and Noah, you and I have daily choices to make. When life’s troubles threaten to destroy us, we can try to handle them in our own strength or the ways of the unbelievers in this world. We can murmur and complain, doubt God and get bitter toward Him and others, or we can follow David’s example, seeking a deeper relationship with our God, looking for and appreciating His beauty in the midst of our troubles. As we trust Him, keeping our eyes on Him, HIS AMAZING GRACE will lift up our head above our enemies!
