

## God's Goodness in the Midst of Battle

"I am confident of this, I will see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living." Psalm 27:13 (NIV)

## Number 37 in the series "God's Faithfulness in My Daily Battles"

Revelation 21:4 tells us that when the believer is in heaven with Jesus, there will be no more tears, no death, no sorrow, or crying. I thank God for that promise. But, in the midst of so many daily battles, in this sin-filled world, I would be overwhelmed with the evil that is all around me if I did not look for and believe to see "the goodness of my Lord in the land of the living." Praise the Lord. By His AMAZING GRACE, no matter how bad things are, I can still see the Lord's goodness everywhere I look!

Galatians 6:9 (KJV) reads, "And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not." Satan constantly tries to wear out believers. He attacks us spiritually, physically, mentally, and emotionally. Parents get weary of disciplining their children and give up. People get weary resisting temptation and give in to sin. Couples get weary trying to make a marriage work, so one or both file for divorce. Many become weary of waiting for God's chosen mate and marry the wrong person. Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ. No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier."
